- The FdSc CAMH commenced in Worcester in 2008
- ► The BSc CAMH top-up commenced in 2015
- Graduates proceed to a variety of destinations including:
- Nursing and Midwifery (all branches)
- Social Work including Step up to Social Work programme
- Teaching
- PG study
- Jobs including:
- Specialist TA
- Healthcare Support Worker Tier 4 CAMH
- Childline Counsellor
- Other CAMH posts
- And many more

Both are full time courses, lectures 1 day per week

- FdSc CAMH: 25% of the course is work based learning
- ▶ 200 hours per year (1 day per week approx.)
- In placement or using your existing job
- Where there are children and young people
- Top-up includes an 8,000-12,000 word dissertation





Do you need previous CAMH study and knowledge to be accepted on to the BSc (Hons) CAMH course?

- ► CAMH knowledge is an advantage but it is not an absolute prerequisite what is; is that you want to work with children, young people and families, are prepared to work hard on academic studies and are willing to do lots of pre course and during course reading! Those of you without this will be expected to engage in some pre-course activities to improve your knowledge prior to starting the course.
- Level 5 to level 6 is quite a jump!
- Criticality, criticality and application— is the answer, this is what we will be looking for in all assignments, which will include presentations, viva voce (oral presentation), essays, an observational study and an independent study

FdSc CAMH: Support and Study time

- Support: each student is allocated a Personal Academic Tutor who they can meet with for academic advice/support and students can also seek extra support from module tutors if required.
- ► Personal Study Time: However you are expected to do (on top of time at University) an extra 126 hours per 15 credit module study time (there are the equivalent of 8 modules per year) So you need to like reading and studying!

BSc (Hons) CAMH Top-up: Support and Study time

- Support: There will be extra tutorial and action learning sets time allocated on Fridays – students to attend as able to and if required.
- Personal Study Time: However you are expected to do (on top of time at University) an extra 120 hours per module study time.

Examples of Assessment Methods

- Recorded role play
- Presentations
- Essays
- Reflective writing and essays
- Observational studies
- Producing a media item/leaflet
- Accomplishment of Core Practice Outcomes in placement
- Viva voce (Oral presentation)






