Entry requirements - PITE

UW Equivalency tests

- GCSE Grade C/4 or above English
- GCSE Grade C/4 or above Maths
- GCSE Grade C/4 or above Science
- UCAS points 112

- Numeracy skills test
- Literacy skills test



Passing the Professional Skills Test

- The first three attempts are free of charge
- Subsequent tests payment of £19.25 per test
- The pass mark depends on the difficulty of the test
- The tests remain valid for three years from the date passed
- Must have applied for a teacher training course before the tests can be taken.
